PROHIBITION OF ENTRY INTO SAFETY ZONE—TARWHINE-1 SUBSEA WELL

I, Digby Glen Crozier, Minister of Mines for the State of Victoria, the Designated Authority in respect of the area specified as being adjacent to the State of Victoria, under the provisions of section 119 of the Act, hereby prohibit from entering into or remaining in, except with my consent in writing, the area of the safety zone described hereunder all vessels other than vessels engaged in or in connection with petroleum exploration operations or operations for the recovery of petroleum authorized by me in the area concerned.

DESCRIPTION OF AREA IN SAFETY ZONE

The area which extends to a distance of five hundred metres measured from a subsea well known as Tarwhine-I situated at or about latitude 38 deg. 24 min. 17 sec. South, longitude 147 deg. 31 min. 41 sec. East and located by means of a wellhead marker buoy described hereunder.

DESCRIPTION OF WELLHEAD MARKER BUOY

A yellow buoy fitted approximately three metres above the water line with a radar reflector and a solar actuated lantern having a flashing yellow light showing the letter U in Morse Code at intervals of thirty seconds. The buoy is marked "Esso-Hematite Tarwhine MK-008".
