17 th & 20 th June	Two whale sighting events onboard the Seven Sisters (possible pygmy blue whale) and Seven Oceanic (2 x possible humpback whale) were not communicated to other vessels within the Scarborough field. Crew completing the sightings had completed Scarborough MFO training as required.	Performance Standard 3.5.1 Sightings of known or possible PBWs and Humpback Whales communicated to other Scarborough Project vessels in the area.	Reminder of requirement for contractor to notify Woodside Site Representative (WSR) if humpback or pygmy blue whale is sighted. WSR will notify other vessels in the Scarborough field. Offshore teams were also given details on peak whale periods for pygmy blue whales and humpback whales, as a reminder of original communications and training.	Flowchart created and rolled out to articulate MFO requirements, including communication process. Scarborough field MFO sighting 'group email' created with all relevant vessel's, to enable more efficient and effective communications.	Use similar communications for future campaigns in Scarborough field as those developed (i.e. flowchart and group email) for the subsea installation campaign. 20 th June	The Mooring Installation Campaign which completed operations in Jan 2025 did not remove all installation aids used subsea for the campaign. Aids left in-situ were identified during review of the As-Left survey reports.	Performance Standard 1.1.1 All installation aids are removed.	Further review of ROV data to confirm what equipment was left behind was carried out. Assessment of recovery opportunity and potential was completed however the ALARP position was determined to be leaving in-situ until future IMMR campaigns or end of field life decommissioning activities.	Woodside undertook First Priority incident reporting and assessment	Prior to future campaign starts, contractor and internal EP requirement sessions to place greater emphasis on installation aids and complete removal of all temporary equipment. Future subsea campaigns risk assessment workshops to emphasise temporary equipment and removal.
